JUSTIFICATION FOR NON-RECURRING & RECURRING EXPENDITURE

(NON-RECURRING)

Land (Enhancement of compensation) 1.

Some of the farmers have filed writ petitions in the Hon'ble District Courts for enhancement of compensation of land. We have already deposited Rs. 7.00 lacs. in the month of April 2004 and it is expected that Hon'ble District Courts may decide the cases in favour of farmers and ask the college to deposit the amount for payment to the farmers. Therefore an amount of Rs. 40.00 Lacs has been proposed in this budget.

2. Buildings.

Ongoing works

Chemical Block (partial completion of 1600 m²)

The construction of Chemical Block measuring 1600 m2 was started in the year 1999-2000 but the same could not be completed due to non-release of funds. In the month of January 2001 the work on the ongoing building was completely stopped as per the orders of then Hon'ble Chairman Board of Governors conveyed through PSTE/IT Punjab. It is assumed that the committee at the Government level was constituted to see the works carried out by NBCC Limited. The condition of the building is deteriorating day by day and if the balance work is not carried out, the condition may further deteriorate. It is therefore proposed that college may be allowed to carry out the work for which Rs. 20.00 Lacs has been proposed in this budget.

Single Seater (Boys Hostels)

To lea which spent The construction of this hostel was also started alongwith Chemical Block but due to the reason mentioned above the work is still pending to be completed. It is therefore proposed that permission may please be accorded to complete the balance work for which Rs. 80.00 Lacs. are required.

Staff Quarters including Warden House.

The constructions of staff quarters started in the year 1998-1999 with a cost of Rs. 250.00 Lacs. The work on staff quarters is also pending due to non-release of funds and reasons mentioned above. To complete the left out houses an amount of Rs. 170.00 Lacs, is required.

However to meet the most essential requirement of houses a provision of Rs. 60.00 Lacs has been made in this budget.

Works to be started

The following buildings are yet to be started as per the detailed Project Report.

Administrative Block (3739 m²)

The construction on administrative block could not be started due to non-availability of proper land and shortage of funds. The Government of Punjab has de-notified the land in the college is now left with only 69.4 Acres of land. The administrative block will now have to be constructed on the available land and for this purpose a provision of Rs. 170.00 Lacs has been made in this budget.

Guest House, Staff Club, Students Activity Centre and Canteen

The work on these buildings could also not be started due to non-availability of proper land and shortage of funds. As the project has already been delayed, it is therefore proposed that construction of these buildings with a cost of Rs. 110.00 Lacs may be allowed to be carried out.

Campus Development including Boundary Wall.

A provision of Rs. 40.00 Lacs has been made in this budget to provide the development works such as sewerage, drainage, water supply, earth filling, roads, electricity and boundary wall as the land under stay has been de-notified by the Govt. of Punjab and hence the boundary wall can be constructed.

MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT.

Keeping in view most essential requirement of the laboratories in the year 2004-2005 and the laboratories which could not be equipped during the year 2003-2004, a provision of Rs. 300.00 Lacs has been made in this budget.

4. PURCHASE OF CAR & TRACTOR:

At present there are four vehicles in the college (one Ambassador Car, one Tata Sumo, Two buses). An ambassador Car which was purchased in the year 1994 is frequently breaks down and need repair which is becoming costly. Secondly there is no Tractor available in the college which is required for the development of the campus and the practical knowledge of the students of Mechanical & Production Engineering Branches. For purchasing two vehicles a provision of Rs. 9.00 Lacs has been made in this budget.

OTHER FACILITIES

5. FURNITURE & FIXTURE:

To equip the lecture halls, tutorial rooms, laboratories, library, hostels, offices, students amenities and sports facilities, a provision of Rs. 11.50 lacs has been made in this budget. The amount as projected will be needed to complete the required furniture and fixture as per plan.

6. LIBRARY

A provision of Rs. 8.00 lacs has been made in the regular budget for purchase of text books hand books, reference books, for meeting the requirement of AICTE, New Delhi for running the six courses.

7. OFFICE EQUIPMENT

For setting up of EPABX system in the college and purchase of additional type writers photocopier-cum-printers, water coolers, display boards, etc. a sum of Rs. 20.00 lacs has been made in this budget.

8. OTHER AMENITIES

For meeting the requirement of medical equipment, sports equipment, hostel equipment a provision of Rs. 5.00 lacs has been made in this budget.

RECURRING

A sum of Rs. 436.60 lacs has been provided in this budget to meet the recurring expenditure during the year 2003-2004.

PAY & ALLOWANCES

A provision of Rs. 350.00 lacs has been made in this budget for the year 2004-2005 which includes the arrears of Rs. 80.00 lacs to be paid to the teaching staff on account of the revision of pay scale by All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi. The requirement of additional staff and placement of staff in higher scales has also been taken care of.

TA & LTC

A provision of Rs. 5.00 Lacs has been made in this budget for meeting the expenses for TA & LTC.

MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT

A nominal amount of Rs. 2.00 lacs has been proposed to meet the medical expenses for indoor treatment of the employee and their families.

CONTIGENCIES

Due to increase in the wages of casual employees, electricity charges, maintenance of computers and other miscellaneous expenses, a provision of Rs. 99.60 lacs been made in this budget under different heads.

ITEM NO. 13.4

PROPOSAL FOR THE EXTENSION OF INTERNET LEASED LINE CONNECTIVITITY FROM 64 KBps TO 256 KBps AT COLLEGE COMPUTER CENTRE.

The Proposal for the installation of 256 KBps leased line/Radio Link connectivity at College Computer Centre has been initiated by the Coordinator, Department of Computer Science & Engineering and Information Technology. At present, our college having 64 KBps Internet Lines, which are very slow. The case regarding the extension in connectivity of the Internet leased line from 64 KBps to 256 KBps was also discussed in the 7th meeting of the Equipment & Store Purchase Committee of the college which was held on 24-12-2001 under the Chairmanship of the Director, Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab, Chandigarh and the item was approved in principle subject to the approval of budget (copy of minutes of meeting is available at Annexure - VI) from page 59 to 61. The approximate cost involved in the extension in Internet leased line connectivity is given as under:

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ITEM NO. 13.5

CREATION OF POST OF HOSTEL ATTENDANTS FOR GIRLS HOSTEL

Presently there are two hostel attendants (women) working in the girls hostel of this college. They are being paid from the amount collected from the mess bills of the girl students thereby putting a financial burden on them.

Punjab Govt. vide Memo No. 2/10/04/5TE2/270 dated 22-1-2004 asked instructed to enhance the wages from Rs. 60/- to Rs. 100/- per day for which the girls students are reluctant. (Copy is placed at Annexure-VII) page from 62 to 64.

On the other hand, three male hostel attendants (already approved) are working in the boys hostels (whose services cannot be taken in Girls hostel) and are being paid through Contractor from college Hostel Accounts. A case for approval of two attendants (women) was sent to Hon'ble TEM-cum-Chairman, B.O.G. who in turn has approval the creation of two posts vide Department of Technical Education & Memo No. 2/10/04-5/TE-2/1063 Dated 07-04-2004 but asked to put up before the Finance Committee for consideration. (A copy is placed at Annexure – VIII) from pages 65 to 66.

It is mentioned herein that total 05 posts of hostel Attendants have already been sanctioned for the five hostels i.e. 04 Boys Hostel & one girls hostel. At present, three male hostel attendants are already working in the Boys Hostels and one Boy Hostel is under construction. As per the sanctioned strength only one female attendant for Girls Hostel can be approved. But if two attendants are to be provided then the new post has to be created. At present we are paying DC rates i.e. Rs. 2651/- per month plus service charges to other attendants through Contractor. However, the pay scale of hostel attendant is Rs. 2520-4140/- with I.S. Rs. 2620/-, and these posts are on regular basis.

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ITEM NO. 13.6 REVISION OF PAY SCALE OF LIBRARY ATTENDANTS AND MEDICAL ATTENDANTS.

Library Attendants & Medical Attendant of this college have requested that their pay scale may be upgraded to Rs. 2720-4260/- at par with SBSCET, Ferozepur (Copy of their request alongwith copy of office order issued by SBSCET, Ferozepur are placed at Annexure – IX) from pages 67 to 74.

At present the Library Attendant & Medical Attendant are getting the pay scale of Rs. 2520-4140/- with I.S. Rs. 2620/- per month. As the qualification followed at B.C.E.T., Gurdaspur & SBSCET, Ferozepur is same for these posts, it is proposed that their pay scale may also be upgraded to Rs. 2720-4260/- at par with SBSCET, Ferozepur.

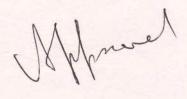
ITEM NO. 13.7 PAYMENT OF CASH HANDLING ALLOWANCE

Since the inception of the college no cash allowance is being paid to the employees handling cash. ITEM NO. 13.9 PAYMENT OF ARREARS ON REVISION OF PAY SCALE TO FACULTY WHO JOINED AFTER 1.1.96.

The Punjab Govt. have notified the revision of pay scales of the teaching staff as per the guidelines issued by AICTE, New Delhi in March, 2000. Arrears have already been released to the faculty who joined before 1.1.96 as per the directions of the Govt. of Punjab. No arrears have been paid to the faculty joined after 1.1.96. They are requesting time and again for release of arrears due to revision of scales. Expenditure involved in this case will be Rs. 15 Lacs approximately as per the basis of norms adopted for payment to faculty joined before 1.1.1996. It is proposed that arrears due to revision of pay scales may be released to the faculty joined after 01-1-1996 involving approximate expenditure of Rs. 15 Lacs. It is added herein that college will not ask any financial help from the Govt. of Punjab for release of arrears to the faculty.

ITEM NO. 13.11 IMPLEMENTATION OF CAREER ADVANCEMENT SCHEMES FOR TEACHERS.

The Punjab Government have notified the scales of the teaching staff of the State managed Engineering Colleges as per the guidelines issued by All India Council for Technical Education, new Delhi in March 2000, which included career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for the teaching staff.

Under the Career Advancement Scheme the Lecturers are to be given a senior scale and Lecturer (Senior Scale) are to be given Lecturer (Selection Grade)/Assistant Professor Grade, whereas Assistant Professor are to be promoted as Professors. The matter regarding implementation of Career Advancement Scheme has been discussed in detail in the meeting of Principals of four Engineering Colleges run by the Govt. of Punjab and recommended that we need to adopt the Career Advancement Scheme for teachers of degree level technical institution in respect of the four state run Engineering Colleges namely GZSCET Bathinda, SBSCET Ferozepur, BCET Gurdaspur and MIMIT Malout (copy of the letter s 15/1/99-5TE2/162 Dated 14-1-04) is placed at Annexure XIV from pages 113 to 122.

As per the recommendations of the Principals, the previous service rendered by the faculty even in the Govt. established colleges will not be counted without the approval of the Government of Punjab. But as per the guidelines issued by AICTE, New Delhi, the previous service of the teachers under these circumstances is to be counted:-

COUNTING OF PAST SERVICE

Previous service, without any break as a Lecturer or equivalent, in a university, college, national laboratory, or other scientific organizations, e.g. CSIR, ICAR, DRDO, UGC, ICSSR, ICHR

and as a UGC Research Scientist, should be counted for placement of lecturer in Senior Scale/Selection Grade provided that:

- The post was in an equivalent grade/scale of pay as the post of a Lecturer.
- The qualification for the post were not lower than the qualifications prescribed by the UGC for the post of lecturer.
- 4. The candidates who apply for direct recruitment should apply through proper channels.
- The concerned Lecturers/possessed the minimum qualifications prescribed by the UC for appointment as Lecturers.
- 6. The post was filled in accordance with the prescribed selection procedure as laid down the University/State Government/Central Government/Institution's regulations;
- 7. The appointment was not ad-hoc or in a leave vacancy of less than one year duration ad hoc service of more than one year duration can be counted provided -
- (a) the ad hoc service was of more than one year duration;
- (b) the incumbent was appointed on the recommendation of duly constituted Selection Committed; and
- (c) the incumbent was selected to the permanent post in continuation to the ad hoc service, without any break.

A copy is placed at Annexure XV on pages from 123 to 127.

Since the Govt. of Punjab has followed the recommendation of AICTE, New Delhi in toto, it is proposed that the benefit of C.A.S. may be given to the eligible faculty as per the guidelines of AICTE, New Delhi & after counting the previous service.

ITEM NO. 13.12 TO CONSIDER ENHANCEMENT IN THE RATE OF HONORARIUM PAYABLE TO THE TEACHERS TO WHOM ADDITIONAL DUTIES OF CHIEF WARDEN/WARDEN ARE ASSIGNED.

TO CONSIDER THE RELEASE OF ARREARS ON ACCOUNT OF UPGRADATION OF PAY SCALES OF WORKSHOP INSTRUCTORS FROM RS. 1640-2925/- (PRE-REVISED) TO Rs. 1800-3200/- (PRE-REVISED).

In the 7th meeting of the Finance Committee held on 26-4-2000 vide Agenda Item No. 7.4 (A), the pay scales of the Workshop Instructors were upgraded from Rs. 1640-2925/- (Un-revised) to Rs. 1800-3200/-(Un-revised). However, it was decided that their pay scales be upgraded from the date of their joining but no arrears are to be paid upto the date of meeting of Finance Committee i.e. 26-4-2000. The pay scales were upgraded in respect of three Workshop Instructor and out of these two were earlier working in SLIET, Longowal and GZSCET, Bathinda and accordingly their pay was protected & paid the arrears on account of their pay protection. Shri Surinder Singh, Workshop Instructor was earlier working in Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa Polytechnic, Chhapian Wali, Malout. Therefore his pay was not protected and no arrears were paid to him. But he is insisting that as per the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court delivered on 18-6-1996 against CWP No. 12821 of 1996 and duly conveyed by Govt. of Punjab Memo No. 9/30/95-3TE1/1370 dated 20-3-1998, the arrears upto 31-12-1997 were to be paid and deposited in their respective GPF Account. A matter was taken up the Govt. of Punjab and Department of Technical Education & Industrial Training, Punjab vide memo No. 16/64/2003-5TE2/2179 dated 17-6-2003 asked to take up this matter again in the Finance Committee. The copies of the correspondence made & notification of the Govt. of Punjab alongwith representation of the official are placed at Annexure - XVI from pages 128 to 133.
